BRIEF PROJECT DESCRIPTION	<p>The ATSU Center for Occupational and Physical Therapy opened its doors on July 22, 2019. Its main focus is to be a teaching center. Because of this, the Center is faculty-supervised and student-run and it operates 4 days a week in the evening. All first-year and second-year DPT students have been involved in patient care as have all second-year OT students and 85% of first-year OT students. Overall, there have been over 1200 student-patient interactions and just over 430 patient treatment sessions for the OT/PT Center.</p> <p>As part of the OT/PT Center, the pelvic health program treats men and women who suffer from pelvic pain, incontinence, and pelvic organ prolapse. The pelvic health program has treated 32</p>

	<p>patients, allowed for 64 student-patient interactions and the demand for pelvic health treatment continues to grow. The pelvic health program initially treated patients on Tuesday evenings, but due to the high demand and growing wait list, the program added a second pelvic floor specialist and is now opened on Monday evenings as well. Currently, the program uses equipment borrowed from a nearby pelvic health clinic. Access to this equipment will end Spring 2020. Securing funds to purchase the Center's own equipment is vital so we can continue to offer this service to the public and allow our students to have outstanding exposure to this area of needed practice.</p> <p>The requested equipment includes surface EMG biofeedback, electrical stimulation, and all needed accessories for pelvic health evaluation and treatment.</p>
EXPECTED OUTCOMES	Acquiring this equipment would allow the pelvic health faculty and students to continue delivering treatment to individuals who suffer from pelvic floor dysfunction, and otherwise would not have access to healthcare. The pelvic health program will be able to remain open so continued interdisciplinary teaching in this specialty area of practice is possible.
